

will be at our February meeting to explain the basics of evolution.


And while we're learning about evolution, we will celebrate **Charles Darwin's birthday** (he'll be 207 on Feb 12<sup>th</sup>).



Its stated goals fit with our mission, which is to foster communication and community among non-believers. Membership cost us nothing, and SPI sounded like a worthwhile organization at the time.

Subsequent news reports and allegations about SPI caused our executive to rethink that decision and withdraw our membership. We notified SPI, and asked to have HAAM removed from their list of supporters. As of January 2016, despite a follow-up letter in the fall, our name has not been removed from SPI's website.

*At this time, HAAM wishes to officially notify our members that we are in NO WAY ASSOCIATED with SPI.*


Jeff fit in a visit to 'Bruce', and 'T-Rex' at the **Fossil Discovery Center** while he was there. He says *"the staff let me go inside*

## IN OUR LIBRARY

In honour of Darwin Day, it's fitting that this month's feature book be about evolution. We have several in our library on the subject, none better than **Your Inner Fish**, by **Neil Shubin**, the paleontologist and professor of anatomy who co-discovered Tiktaalik. Haven't heard of **Tiktaalik**? It's the transitional fossil that creationists always claim doesn't exist...



Shubin looks at aspects of human anatomy and senses (touch, smell, hearing, vision, etc) and traces them back - way back, explaining what paleontology, comparative anatomy, genetics, embryology and developmental biology have to tell us about the human body. Reviewers note that Shubin excels at explaining the science, and that his writing style is engaging, funny, and informative.

## MEDICALLY ASSISTED DYING UPDATE

The Supreme Court of Canada recently granted a four-month extension to their ruling last year which would have removed medically assisted dying from the Criminal Code on Feb 6th. Assisted dying will now become a reality across Canada on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2016, and all the major stakeholders are scrambling to get their ducks in a row.

The federal government has no law yet proposed, and many supporters of physician-assisted dying (PAD) question whether one is needed at all. No new abortion law was enacted when abortion decriminalized; it was simply left up to the health care system to regulate. There is no reason why PAD could not be handled in the same way. That said, the health care system does not appear ready to handle PAD.

Many of the questions that remain to be answered relate to one of two major areas – logistics, and handling of conscientious objectors.

Logistics concerns mostly practical problems like who will pay for ambulance rides if a patient must be transferred to another facility to receive this service. How will doctors be paid? How will PAD be provided to patients in rural and remote areas? How will physicians be trained and who will train them? Most of these issues are likely to be worked out over the next little while, as with any new treatment or service, and policies and procedures are put into place.

Conscientious objectors pose a different dilemma. Is it reasonable to allow publicly funded institutions to refuse to provide a legal, government-insured service? Most religiously-affiliated hospitals and care homes will certainly attempt to refuse PAD on their premises. They are already allowed to refuse to provide abortions.

What about the duty to refer? The Manitoba College of Physicians recently announced new policy guidelines on PAD. They are [available to read](#) on the college's [website](#). They clearly state that a doctor who does not support PAD is not required to participate in it, provide any information about it, or refer to a doctor who will provide it. Doctors *are* required to refer their patients to a 'resource' that will provide information, but 'resource' is defined as 'physicians, health care providers, counsellors and publicly available resources which can be accessed without a referral.' That's a pretty broad definition, and it suggests there will be

loopholes similar to those encountered by women seeking abortions – referrals to 'pro-life' organizations masquerading as counselling services.

There are other considerations. Refusals and referrals will cause unnecessary delays and frustration for patients. What about doctors who refuse to obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for PAD so that they can deliberately claim that they are not competent to carry it out? What about physicians in religious communities who fear that their practice may be boycotted if they participate in PAD? What if they fear not just for their livelihood, but for their personal safety? Will physicians become the targets of radical opponents of PAD in the same way as abortion providers have been? What about patients in religious communities who cannot find anyone in their area to meet their request?

The Supreme Court decision on PAD clearly favors patient autonomy over provider values. This is because the patients who request assisted dying rarely have other options; very few have the money and personal resources to travel to Switzerland. The Supreme Court made it clear that all Canadians are entitled to choice in dying. Too much tolerance of conscientious objectors will result in patchy or severely restricted access to this service, and the people most adversely affected will be patients who are already suffering.



Almost a year has passed since the Supreme Court decision, and sadly, it appears that most of the major groups affected by it (health care facilities, professional regulatory bodies, and governments) have failed to adequately address its implications and formulate policies and procedures to accommodate assisted dying as part of the health care spectrum. Many groups seemed to be hoping that the issue would go away, that the government would stall, or the decision would be overturned. Others seem to be trying to see how little service they can legally offer. Let's hope that in the near future, all the interested and affected parties will get their act together and put a plan in place to provide this service to those requesting it. We know there are already people waiting.
